Top Tips


The secret to success is practising little and often. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey?

$$\begin{array}{lllll} 0+5=5 & 0+4=4 & 0+3=3 & 0+2=2 & 0+1=1 \\ 1+4=5 & 1+3=4 & 1+2=3 & 1+1=2 & 1+0=1 \\ 2+3=5 & 2+2=4 & 2+1=3 & 2+0=2 & \\ 3+2=5 & 3+1=4 & 3+0=3 & & \\ 4+1=5 & 4+0=4 & & & \\ 5+0=5 & & & & \end{array}$$

<p>Challenge 1:</p> 	<p><u>Money</u></p> <p>Using five 1p coins, how many different ways can you share 5 pennies between 2 people?</p> <p>Repeat for four 1p coins and three 1p coins.</p>
<p>Challenge 2:</p> 	<p><u>Fruit sharing</u></p> <p>Using 5 pieces of fruit and 2 plates, how many different ways can you group them?</p>
<p>Challenge 3:</p> 	<p><u>Hidden parts</u></p> <p>Place 5 toys on the table. Place a cloth over some of the toys. Show your child how many are left. How many are hiding under the cloth?</p>
<p>Challenge 4:</p> 	<p><u>Singing and Dancing</u></p> <p>Sing the number bonds for 5 with Jack Hartman</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=y1oa6oOfMKk</p>
<p>Challenge 5:</p> 	<p><u>Save the whale</u></p> <p>The whale is trapped in the lake.</p> <p>Add lengths of pipe until the total is 5.</p> <p>Then turn the wheel valve to set the water pouring.</p> <p>If your answer is correct the whale will swim off to sea.</p> <p>https://ictgames.com/saveTheWhale/</p>
<p>Challenge 6:</p> 	<p><u>Finger bonds</u></p> <p>Show your child a number using your fingers. Can they show you the number bond that will make 5?</p> <p>For example; if you show 3, your child will show you 2 to make the number bond for 5.</p>
