It is expected that children in Nursery will be able to compare two groups of objects, saying when they have the same number or using the vocabulary of more or fewer/less. Your child may want to touch or move the objects to count and will need to understand that numbers are used to represent how many are in a set.

### Top Tips

The secret to success is practising little and often. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey?

Challenge 1: Decorate Biscuits	Bake and decorate some biscuits with sweets, raisins etc. Stick to no more than about 6 toppings per biscuit. Decorate one at the same time as your child and then compare, whose biscuit has more sweets, do they have the same?
Challenge 2: Ladybird Counting 	Ladybird Spots includes counting, matching and ordering numbers games, which can help with learning to count and recognising the numbers and number words up to 10.
Challenge 3: How many animals?	Set up two pens or fields and collect some animals to go in them. Choose the number of animals you want to put in your field and your child does the same. Do you have the same amount?
Challenge 4: Building towers	Use a construction toy such as Duplo, wooden blocks etc. You and your child each build a tower, no more than about 6 blocks high. Compare them, are they the same height? Whose is taller?
Challenge 5: Snack time	Choose a small snack such as raisins or Cheerios and put a few (no more than six) onto two plates. Whose plate has more? Eat the snacks and have another go. Are they the same this time? Your child could do this with a sibling or a toy sitting at the other plates.
Challenge 6: Chinese Dragon Game 	Our Chinese Dragon Game is designed to fit into a Chinese New Year topic. It is an ordering and sequencing numbers game based on the Chinese New Year dragon theme. Order numbers 0 5 at first and then move on to 0 to 10.
