It is expected that children in Year 1 will be able to compare numbers within 20, identifying numbers that are more than, less than or equal to each other. Children in Year 1 should be able to compare numbers to 20 using resources and written questions.

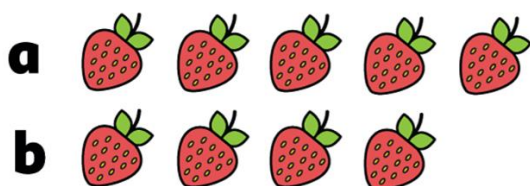

You could try some of these ideas...

Dinner time

Choose a small selection of food and put a few (no more than twenty) onto two plates. Whose plate has more? Eat the food and have another go. Are they the same this time? Your child could do this with a sibling or a toy sitting at the other plate.



Comparing groups

Can you compare the two groups?

E.g. When the strawberries are in a line, it is easier to see which bowl has the most.

Comparing groups

Here are pictures of two numbers. Count the spots in each ten frame.

Which number is the smallest?

When comparing two numbers, we can write both numbers down and use either 'greater than' or 'smaller than' in a short sentence. For example:

16 is **smaller than** 19

or

19 is **greater than** 16
