Retrieval

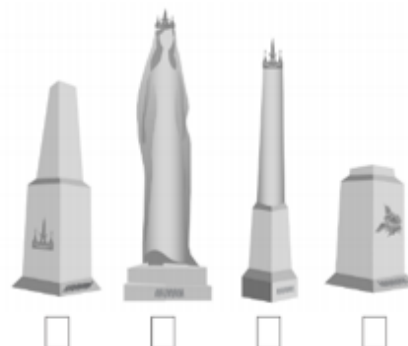


Retrieval is when you have to pick out information from a text in order to answer questions about it.
