

## Communicate

Play 'Simon Says'. Ask a grown up to give you some instructions but you only do them when they say 'Simon Says'. Listen carefully and try not to get caught out. Then you could swap over and give the instructions. (ELG: Communication and Language)



## Role Play

Collect your favourite teddies or toys and create ways you can help them. Can you teach them in a classroom? Rescue them when they are stuck? Give them first aid if they are hurt? (ELG: Personal, Social and Emotional Development)
