Outdoor sentence building game

The aim of the game is to make the most ridiculous sentence possible!

How to play:

1. Number each other 1 and 2.
2. Person 2 begins the sentence by writing any word in chalk on the ground or on the wall
3. Person 1 follows by adding to the sentence with another word.
4. Take it in turns to complete the sentence until one player decides to end the sentence.
5. Once the sentence is complete, add up your points and start again.

Points Guide

- Use a conjunction: 5 points
- Use a relative clause: 5 points
- Use a fronted adverbial: 4 points
- Use speech: 4 points
- Use a question/exclamation mark: 3 points
- Use a full stop: 1 point

Conjunction clips

Make yourself some conjunction cards and use paperclips to join two clauses together.



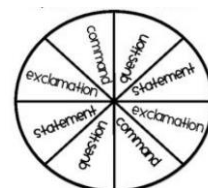
Kung Fu punctuation

Create your own moves for punctuation e.g. full stop = punch, comma = kick jump, semi-colon = full stop punch then do the comma shape underneath.

Spin a sentence game

Use a pencil and a paper clip to spin the spinner. Make yourself subject cards (e.g. food, holidays, video games). Draw a subject from the subject card and write a sentence that goes with the type of sentence you spun on your spinner.



Contractions memory game

1. Create some contractions cards for yourself.
2. Arrange the cards face down all over the floor or table.
3. Player A goes first and chooses two cards, if they match, the player gets to keep the cards, if they do not, the cards are to be turned back over and the next player goes.
4. Continue playing until all the cards have been matched.
