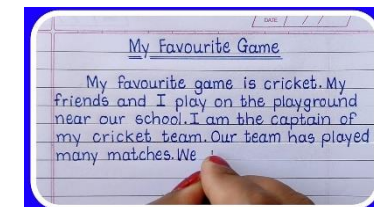
Think about these questions and write some interesting metaphors: What do they look like? What do they do? What are they famous for? What is their character like?
