### Summary of Sports Premium Funding Spending 2023-2024

Here at Valley Primary School, we want children to develop a passion for physical activity and develop a love of sport, so that children want to take part in sporting activities outside of school and continue with a sport once they leave primary school. We also want children to understand the importance of living a fit and healthy lifestyle. Therefore, we have focused on spending the Sports Premium Funding in three areas; **the P.E curriculum, extra-curricular activities and living a healthy lifestyle**. We believe investing in these three areas will help us accomplish our mission.

Our objectives in using the PSPG for the academic year 2023-2024 are as follow:

- Developing staff expertise in teaching P.E.
- Buying high quality resources for the teaching of P.E and to meet the needs of the national curriculum.
- Purchasing resources to allow children to be active during break and support lunchtimes.
- Increasing participation in extra-curricular clubs.
- Providing a range of opportunities for enrichment activities after school.
- Increase the percentage of children leaving school able to swim 25m.
