Asia (Personal Development)

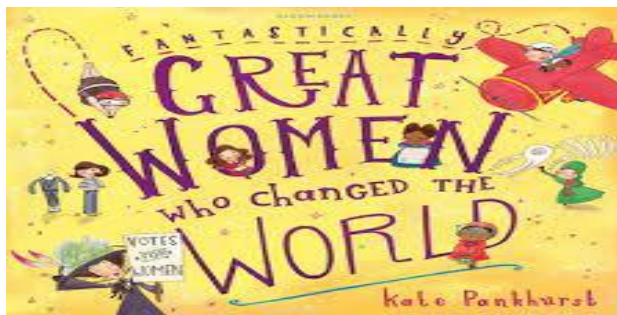
- A: Create a digital collage of inspirational women through history.
