

Europe (English)

A: Write a menu for a banquet fit for a Tudor King or Queen.

B: Create a storyboard telling the story of the Spanish Armada-May 1588.

C: Use your non-fiction writing skills to create a detailed fact file about the five Tudor Kings and Queens 1485 – 1603.

North America (SMSC)

A: Find out which religion was followed by the royals at this time.

B: Create a fact poster about the laws that were followed at this time.

C: Compare the English, Spanish and French Royal Families at this time.

Asia (Personal Development)

A: Research what instruments were played during the Tudor times.

B: Create a Tudor-style dance to the tune *Greensleeves* which is rumoured to have been composed by Henry VIII.

C: Create a PowerPoint showing a timeline of Henry VIII's reign as King of England.

Riotous Royals British Values – Tolerance

Over the next two half terms, we will investigate who was the most intolerant monarch in Tudor times and survey school grounds to plan a Tudor-style garden. We will design and complete a Tudor embroidery piece as well as explore portraiture from the Tudor period in view of sketching our own.

Antarctica (Topic: Geography & DT)

A: Research why The River Thames was important to the Tudors.

B: The Tudor family was linked to many different countries in Europe. Use a map to locate the different Royal heritage countries.

C: Henry VIII supposedly played a great version of 'Green Sleeves' on the lute. Could you design a musical instrument out of junk that could replicate the shape of this instrument?

Africa (Maths)

A: Draw pictures of Tudor money and write the value of the coins.

B: Create an exquisite banquet with the cost of each item on the menu. Remember, Tudor money was expressed as the letter 'd' for denarius not pennies.

C: Design a Tudor house including measurements in cm and m.

South America (Healthy Schools)

A: There was no electricity in Tudor homes. What light sources could the Tudors have used?

B: Sugar was new to Britain in Tudor times but only very rich people could afford it. Make a poster to show Tudor people how to take care of their teeth.

C: Research Tudor sports and create a fact file to explain the most popular games.

Australasia (Topic: Art & Design and History)

A: Who was Edward I and why was he important to Henry VIII?

B: Create an interactive or flap book timeline of the kings and queens that ruled during the Tudor reign.

C: Create a Tudor crown fit for King Henry VIII or Elizabeth I – think carefully about the materials and style you want to create.
